From Pastor Doane's desk....

"We rejoice and delight in you" (Song of Solomon 1:4, NIV)

We will not enter the gates of the year to the somber sound of the dirge, but to the sweet strains of glad carols and anthems of rejoicing. We who adore the author of joy will defy despair and sadness with delight and gladness.

Eternal Spirit, our Comforter, we who are the temples in which you reside, will never quit exalting the name of Jesus. We are resolved He must have the crown of our heart's delight.

We are chosen to be minstrels of the heavens. So, let us rehearse our sacred anthem before we sing it in the halls of the New Jerusalem.

We will be glad and rejoice: two words with one sense, double joy, recurring delight, blessing upon blessing. Need there be any limit to our rejoicing in the Lord even now? What unending streams of happiness flow from Him!

O gracious Lord Jesus, favor us this year with such sense of your magnificence, that from its first to its last day we may be glad and rejoice in you. Let January open with joy in the Lord, and December close with delight in Jesus.

What you just read is my paraphrase of a New Year's Day meditation by Charles H. Spurgeon, one of the great 19th century preachers and called by many "the prince of preachers."

Encouraging God's people with news about the "Year of God's Favor", Isaiah said;

- ...you will <u>receive</u> a double portion,
- ...you will <u>rejoice</u> in your inheritance.
- ...you will inherit a double portion in your land,
- ...and everlasting joy will be yours.

I <u>delight</u> greatly in the LORD;

my soul <u>rejoices</u> in my God.

(Isaiah 61:7, 10, NIV)

I wonder if Mary recalled some of Isaiah's words when she offered her song of praise. "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior" (Luke 1:46ff).

I pray we will each offer Him our own song of praise as we launch 2019, accepting our double inheritance – delight and joy, satisfaction and gladness. May these be multiplied to you.
